Our Redeemer's Lutheran Church Quarterly Meeting Minutes August 3, 2025

Meeting Details

The quarterly meeting took place on August 3, 2025, and was called to order by Council President Karen Zahn at 10:03 AM. Pastor Beth Macha opened the gathering with prayer.

Agenda Amendment

The agenda was amended so that new business, specifically the motion proposal, was discussed first to allow all members to contribute before departing. The amendment was moved by Ken H. and seconded by Roy L.

Church Siding and Roof Replacement Proposal

The Church Council presented a motion to begin planning for future replacement of the church's siding and roofing materials. Due to previous experiences with repairs from summer 2023 to fall 2024, which involved navigating insurance and contractor selection, it was recommended that preparation and savings be prioritized. Samples of proposed siding and steel roofing products were made available for review.

The Council's initial motion proposed siding that does not require painting and steel roofing instead of traditional shingles. Many questions arose, primarily regarding the purpose of the proposal, which was clarified as being for future needs and not for immediate action. Because the church constitution requires council permission for expenditures over \$5,000, this motion was strictly preparatory.

After thorough discussion, the council's original motion was overturned by a unanimous show of hands. A new motion, introduced by Maddy H., allowed the Church Council to investigate and select materials for future siding and roofing replacements. Karen H. seconded the motion, and a ballot vote resulted in 23 yes and 1 no. The motion passed.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the previous quarterly meeting on April 13, 2025, were approved following a motion by Jack R., seconded by Dodie J.

August was also a month to prepare for all the events that took place in September:

- ➤ On September 1, we had a float in the Suring Labor Day parade for the second time. We gave out pens, bouncy balls, and tee shirts from the float. We also had 2 people handing out dog treats to the dogs who were in attendance watching the parade. We ended up placing 2nd for the float

Landscape Committee Report

3rd Quarter Congregational Report - October 2025

Overview of Landscape Improvements

During the third quarter of 2025, our congregation's landscape received significant improvements. A memorial forsythia shrub in honor of Jennifer Jandt was planted in the flagpole garden, serving as a living tribute. Additionally, a new Colorado Spruce tree was placed between two mature trees on the east side of the parking lot, contributing to the ongoing beautification of our grounds.

Garden Border Updates

Macha's Yard Maintenance completed the removal of the large rock borders surrounding both the flagpole garden and the boulder garden. To replace these borders, Roy Lawrenz and Ken Holmes installed a new edge using interlocking bricks, providing a fresh and organized appearance.

Prayer Garden Enhancements

The rectangular boxes around the columns in the prayer garden, which previously contained only a partial layer of mulch, were fully filled with pea gravel and finished with white premium marble stone. This improvement was carried out by Jack Rabe and B.J. Douglass, resulting in a cleaner and more polished look for the prayer garden.

Pruning, Watering, and Lawn Maintenance

Necessary pruning of shrubs was performed by Jack Rabe and Ken Holmes, helping to maintain the health and appearance of the landscape. Watering of the landscaped beds was largely assisted by favorable weather, requiring only minimal assisted watering. Weekly grass cutting continues to be faithfully done by Roy Lawrenz and Gregg Stabbe.

Seasonal Cleanup

Fall cleanup has commenced, with Diane Rivard and B.J. Douglass trimming stalks of spent blooms to prepare the landscape for the upcoming season.

- 1) Sanctuary Lighting: The can lights and spotlights illuminating the chancel area have been successfully replaced.
- Additional Projects: Earl has completed several smaller repairs, including the replacement of door closers on restroom and quilting room doors.
 Note that these doors are hollow core and susceptible to damage if overextended.
- 3) Water issues we have had sand coming in from the well which has affected our sinks, toilets, the water softener system and hot water tanks. All affected systems have been addressed, and it is anticipated that adjusting the well pump depth will resolve this issue.
